NEW CENTRE FOR HOUSTON'S, [US] JAIN COMMUNITY - New Jain centre 'Preksha Meditation Center' built on 6,000-square-foot is due to open at Housten. Over \$2 million raised entirely from voluntary donations has been spent in the construction. The facility's main room features a 3,600-square-foot cardinal-pyramid meditation hall, shaped to enhance the meditation experience. Beginning with only 40 followers at the inception of JVB Houston 10 years ago, the Jain organization has seen tremendous growth. Samanijis, (similar to Catholic nuns) were sent here from India to run the local organization, lead meditation, hold workshops, seminars, youth camps, and

provide counseling. Both Samanijis have master's degrees in religion and Jainism, and have taken lifetime vows. Terapanth Acharya Mahapragya's disciples Samani Akshay Pragyaji has been the guiding force behind the project. Grand opening events include special speakers, meditation and yoga events, dinners, and cultural programs for three days.

SUPREME COURT BAN ON BUILDING OF WORSHIPPING HOUSES AT PUBLIC PLACES

The Supreme Court has issued an interim order and directed all the State Governments to ensure that no public places or road sides shall be permitted to establish any temples, mosque, church or gurudwara in its premises. This order shall remain in force till the apex court arrives at a final decision on this issue. The order shall apply to all the states in the union of India and the centrally-ruled states. The decision about removing all the encroachments, however, which have taken place in the past has yet to be taken by the Court.



NAKODAJI TEERTH, RAJSTHAN NEEDS BETTER MAINTENANCE -

Nakodaji Teerth is no less of importance for entire Swetamber Jain Community than Badrinath / Kedarnath to Hindu's, Jerusalem to Christens and Makka Madina to Muslims etc. This auspicious and highly respected and believed teerth is situated in hills near Jodhpur in Rajasthan. The place is visited by lakhs of dedicated pilgrims and devotees (BOTH JAINS AND NON-JAINS) from all over the world. In fact most of the people repeatedly visit and consider it to be no less then Vaishno Devi and Tirupati for Hindu's. The number of people visiting and staying overnight is increasing year after year. Considering the requirements of infrastructural facilities in the temple complex some development have also taken place.

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But if we look at the expectation of today's generation, the facilities available are hardly satisfactory. Immediate attention is required to paid in the following areas.

- **1. Basic Sanitary Facilities:** Most of the toilets are extremely dirty and unusable. As local people are not available for the job, management can give Sanitary Contract to established organization like "Sulabh International" etc.
- **2. Water Problem:** Water is really scarce in the area. Substantial amount is paid for arranging water through contactors. This is not a permanent solutions. Since, the management has adequate financial resources problem can be permanently resolved. First method, could be, deep water tube wells in nearby areas. Secondly, the Government can be approached to provide exclusive water supply line for the temple. Plenty of potable water is available within 50 to 100 Km. radius of the temple. Nearby villages have fertile and agricultural land. Temple management can approach and compel State Government to solve this problem. Jain Community is very strong both politically and

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financially. If at all required, temple funds can also be used for water project. Thirdly, now a days it is also possible to install water treatment plant for the improvement of water quality.

- **3. Local People:** Temple should create self employment avenues for local people. Whatever educational facilities exist, need modernization and improvement. This can be done on the lines of "Sai Baba" town in south.
- **4. Health Facilities:** Technically, there is no medical aid available in the area. What is sometimes available is just one retired doctor without any supporting staff. Temple should request some community member to run at least 20 bed hospital and it should also be open to local population. Once again money is not an issue at temple.
- **5. Bhojanshala:** Grand Building is used for the purpose. But again the management is extremely poor. The place gets dirty, toilets are always stinking, wash basins are choked, Utensils not properly washed, food quality which used to be great a few years before, has substantially deteriorated. I feel present food charges are reasonable but if required these can be increased to bring improvements.

- **6. Dharmashala: -** Number of room have been added but maintenance is poor. A lot can be learnt from Pawapuri Temple which is not very far away from this place.
- **7. Temple Building:** In view of ever increasing number of people to the temple, it is important to provide separate entry and exit gates in the main temple. Present entrance is very small and used for both entry and exit. This is an emergency requirement as temple is fully packed at the time of "Aarti".
- **8. Security: -** Number of plain clothes security guards should be appointed, Cameras can also placed at critical points. Safe deposit vaults facility can also be provided.
- **9. Vehicle Parking: -** Parking lots for all types of vehicles should be identified and structured. Presently it is chaotic, disorganized and unsafe for visitors.
- **10. Shops Out Side Temple Gate:** A few shops can be nicely constructed with in temple premises and allotted. Existing shops are spoiling the aesthetic look of the front gate of the temple.
- **11. Ornamentation of Surroundings Hills:** Some kind of plantation of on hills suitable to the environment and climate will improve the visual look of the place.
- **12. Staff Training:** All the employees working in the temple complex should be in uniform and carry name card with designation etc. Proper job training should also given to the employees. There salaries and allowance should be structured and transparent. Individual tipping should be restricted.
- 13. Temple Accounts: Copy of temple accounts should be made public for better transparency. Cash handling procedure

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can be reviewed. Auditor's can also be rotated. Besides, Statutory Auditor's should also issue separately a long form report about the working of the trust and irregularities noticed during the year procedural checks.

Besides above there are many other smaller issues where attention can be paid to make the visitors comfortable. Each one of us is blessed by this Teerth and we have a duty to do this. I request the esteemed members of the management committee to consider my suggestions and make an attempt to implement them wherever possible. I look forward to have your response on this subject. INSTITUTIONS

BH. MAHAVEER VIKLANG SAHAYATA SAMITI TO PROVIDE ARTIFICIAL LIMBS TO SRI LANKAN TAMILS - In a bid to help Sri Lankan Tamils maimed by war, India will distribute artificial limbs at a month-long free medical camp in Jaffna in December. As a pilot project, 600 people who lost their limbs in mine blasts and other war-related incidents will be given artificial limbs at a cost of Rs 15 lakh. Jaipur-based Bhagwan Mahaveer Viklang Sahayata Samiti will provide the limbs at an average cost of Rs 2,000. BMVSS is being run by Dr D R Mehta former chairman of SEBI. A 15-member medical team would stay at the camp for a month and manufacture artificial limbs after taking measurements of the beneficiaries. BMVSS uses highly advanced technology in manufacturing artificial limbs. Unlike earlier artificial limbs, the new ones are much lighter. BMVSS is also planning to conduct similar camps in Iraq, Turkey, Palestine and the UAE.

According to French Charity Handicap International, which works with victims of war throughout the world, nearly 30,000 Tamil people were maimed. The organisation has a small factory in Batticaloa in Sri Lanka, producing artificial limbs.

JAIN MANUSCRIPTS TO BE AVAILABLE ON INSTITUTE OF JAINOLOGY WEBSITE

More than 4,000 Jain manuscripts, some dating back to the ninth century BC, are being immortalised in a digitised encyclopedia that will be available to all shortly. 'Jainpedia' is the creation of the Institute of Jainology, formed by the Jain Diaspora in Britain. The collection of manuscripts include scriptures from British institutions like the Victoria and Albert Museum, British Library, Bodleian Library and Wellcome Trust. The manuscripts cover areas like hymns and prayers,

accounts of the lives of the founders of Jainism, didactic literature, lexicography, poetics, philosophy, astrology, karma literature, texts on pilgrimage places and on daily rituals.

In view of scholarly interests, the institute has decided to make the collection accessible to a wider audience. "This question of access was multi-faceted - physical contact with these manuscripts can be difficult as some are rare, many centuries old and fragile. Even if one could get to them, many are in languages that have not been spoken for a millennia and more. To make them more intelligible, the digitised images will be contextualized with commentaries from modern scholars, audio and video material and translations of the original texts apart from material for schools and young people. Mr. Harshad Sanghrajka who is associated with the project since beginning says that, over 3 lakh people would benefit from the project. In particular, school children in England, where the institute has brought Jainism into the English National Curriculum will benefit. This rite is a 'holistic healer' that assists in saving and accumulating the otherwise wasted energy. The power and benefits of the vibratory effect of the mantras and sūtras recited in this process, brings about a change in the aura and lesyā. The sūtras need to be recited only in the Prākrit language. Pratikramana could go a long way in helping modify the values in society, bringing back awareness and awakening, feelings of love, compassion, brotherhood ness and friendship in the minds and hearts of the people. Pratikramana is much more than just forgiving, forgetting and pardoning. The thesis brings

JAINA LEGISLATIVE CONFERENCE: PEACE, HARMONY & NON-VIOLENCE - Washington, Non-violence, the importance of relationship-building, and religious harmony, were key themes of the Federation of Jain Associations in North America's Legislative Conference held from October 6-7 in Washington, D.C. The conference was supported by the American Jewish Committee and the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin.

The conference events were spread over two days. Attendees included nearly 70 JAINA executives, members from North America, and India. The conference was coordinated by Dr. Sushil Jain, First Vice President of JAINA; Dino Teppara, Director of Legislative Affairs for AAPI; and Nissim B. seven years.

Ranakpur Jain Temple - Ranakpur is a village located in Desuri Tehsil near Sadri town in the Pali District of Rajasthan in western India. It is located between Jodhpur and Udaipur, in a valley on the western side of the Aravalli Range. The Ranakpur Jain Temples command huge respect from the Jain community worldwide. Built during the rule of Rana Kumbha, these temples have included Ranakpur in the list of five main pilgrim destinations of Jains in India. History has it that Rana Kumbha donated a vast stretch of land to Dhanna Shah so as to enable him to realize his dream of building a great temple. Today, these temples attract thousands of visitors every year from across the country and abroad. Temples of Ranakpur present a distinct style of their own. The ceilings of the

temples are adorned with foliate scrollwork and geometric patterns. The top and bottom part of the domes are joined by Brackets with figures of deities on them. The most important amongst all the temples within the complex is the Chaumukha Temple. Dedicated to the first Jain Tirthankara, Adinath, it is a four faced temple which has a basement of 48000 sq feet. The temple boasts of four subsidiary shrines, 24 pillared halls and 80 domes standing on the support of nearly 400 columns (the total number of columns in the temple complex, however, is much larger, around 1444). Each of the columns is richly carved and interestingly no two columns present the same design. Moreover, the columns change colour from golden to pale blue with the passage of every hour during the day. So much for the artistic brilliance of the workmen! The temple is shaped like a Nalinigulm Vimana or heavenly aircraft that the Shah had seen in his dreams. The construction of the temple is extremely complex with four separate entrances leading to chambers inside. The chambers finally lead to the main hall which houses the image of Adinath encircled by several smaller shrines and domes. Another range of cells with individual roofs surround these shrines and domes yet again. Perhaps, the complexity of the structure was reason why the temple took around 65 years to complete.

Dilwara Jain Temple - Dilwara Jain temples are known world over for its extraordinary architecture and marvelous marble stone carvings, some experts also consider it architecturally superior to the Taj Mahal. It seems fairly basic temple from outside but every cloud has a silver lining, the temple interior showcases the extraordinary work of human craftsmanship at its best. These temples were built between 11th to 13th century AD, The beautiful lush green hills surrounding the temple gives a very pleasant feeling. The ornamental details of marble stone carvings is phenomenal and unmatched, The minutely carved ceilings and the pillars are just amazing. All this was done at a time when no



transport or roads were available at a height of 1200+ Mtrs in Mount Abu, Huge blocks of marble stones were transported on elephant backs from the Arasoori Hills at Ambaji to this remote hilly region of Mount Abu. Dilwara temples is also a popular Jain pilgrimage attraction.

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Of the five shrines in this group, four are architecturally significant. They are built with white marble stones. Each has a walled courtyard. In the centre of the courtyard is the shrine with the image of the deity, Rishabhdev. Around the large courtyard, there are numerous small shrines, each housing a beautiful image of the Tirthankaras with a series of elegantly carved pillars from the entrance to the courtyard. The ministers of the Solanki rulers of Gujarat had constructed all these temples during 11th and 13th centuries A.D.

Vimal Vasahi is the oldest temple, which has been dedicated to Adinath, the first Jain Tirthankara. Vimal Shah, minister of the then Solanki ruler of Gujarat, built it in the year 1031 A.D. The special feature of this temple is it's ceiling which is circular in eleven richly carved concentric rings. The central ceiling of the temple is adorned with magnificent carving and it culminates into an ornamented central pendant. The pendant of the dome tapers down forming a drop or point, like a lotus flower. This is an astonishing piece of work. It symbolizes the divine grace coming down to fulfill human aspirations. Figures of 16 Vidya Devis (goddesses of knowledge) are carved on the ceiling. The other Dilwara temples are the Luna Vasahi, Vastupala and Tejapala, named after the ministers of the then Vaghela ruler of Gujarat who built them in 1230 A.D. Inspite of being plain and austere on the outside, the interiors of all these temples are covered with delicate carvings. Its most notable feature is that the brilliant intricacy and delicacy of the marble carving is so fine that in places the marble becomes almost transparent.

Dilwara temples are one of the best examples of craftsmanship, the genius of carving out so brilliant and intricate a shape out of a block of stone, such that it almost comes to life! The temple is a tourist's paradise and a meditative sanctum for the devotees.

DR. TRIPUTI JAIN CONDUCTING LIFE REGRESSION SHOWS ON TELEVISION

AMAR JAIN'S EFFORTS BRING CHANGE IN UNIVERSITY RULES FOR VISUALLY IMPAIRED STUDENTS - Mumbai: A visually-impaired law student has finally won his battle against the Mumbai University after almost two years of perseverance. Amar Jain, a second year law student, refused to use a writer for his exams after a couple of bad experiences in the past. Well-versed in computers, Jain insisted on attempting his papers online in stead. However, the University rulebook did not permit any such liberty for a handicap student. After pursuing for almost two years, the controller of examination finally granted him the permission on Friday. Jain, a student of the Government Law College, Churchgate, got a writer from a Hindi medium school to write his English paper in his class XII exams. He was disappointed to get only 55 marks because Jain had been a distinction student all his life. He decided to learn computers and was happy that he could attempt his own exams with the help of a screen-reading software. However, the University had not adopted the University Grants Commission (UGC)'s circular allowing blind students to use computers, which was passed in 2006.

With a little help from his principal, Parimala Rao, Jain approached the university. His application was forwarded to the Dean of Law, Mumbai University, which was then handed over to the controller of examination. However, nothing happened after that and repeated inquiries with the additional registrar's office at the examination house in Kalina were futile.

This year, Jain directly wrote to the vice-chancellor's office, on his new principal's suggestion. He approached the VC's office, early this month, and was pleasantly surprised by their quick response. "My letter was forwarded to the controller of examination this month. And they have finally granted me permission to write the exams using the screen-reader software this Friday. I am thankful to the controller of examination and the VC for finally making this provision available to me," said Jain. The controller of examination, Vilas Shinde, however, said, "The letter came to me and within three days I passed the order. The state government had already issued a circular in the past allowing blind students to use computers or typewriters, but the university needs to release its own circular on the same. So the permission was not granted. The student should have directly approached higher authorities earlier."

IS MEAT EATING AN ACT OF VIOLENCE? By Renato Pichler, President Swiss Union for Vegetarianism. www.vegetarismus.ch

Violence toward animals is today so commonplace that it is even subsidized with tax funds. Virtually no-one would allege that a slaughterhouse is a place of peace. But just as few are the opinion that the violence committed toward the so-called "economically useful animals" (live-stock) could contribute to the level of violence displayed between humans.

A glance at the goings on inside the slaughterhouses are proof enough that meat production without use of violence is simply not possible. The killing of sentient fellow creatures is practiced x-times daily. Most humans are in comfortable denial of this fact ("It's not that bad" / "there's nothing we can do about it" / "one has to kill, in order to live" etc.).

"Meat production" as an exceptional case - Meat production holds a privileged position in our society despite the obvious violence inflicted towards our fellow creatures. It is the only completely legal use of violence resulting in death(1), which is not only socially accepted, but also promoted by society (distribution of state subsidies and financially supported by our society through meat sales). It is viewed simply as "unavoidable", just like human deaths during times of war.

The "suffering" amongst humans, which would result from the renouncement of the systematic use of violence toward "live-stock" through the renouncement of meat consumption, is socially classified as worse than the suffering endured by the animals being slaughtered.

Expert opinions - Interestingly enough, psychologists repeatedly discuss the possibility of whether violent computer games are causing children to become cruel. Even though the killings in such games, however realistically portrayed, are only fictitious, contrary to the real killings of animals, the violence against animals is only seldom integrated into the prevention of cruelty. However, at least those experts dealing daily with human violence, currently see a close relationship between violence toward animals and violence toward humans(2).

In Florida there is an independent police unit(3) which deals exclusively with violence toward animals and that with similar harshness as with social violence between humans. The reason: FBI investigations found that there was a similarity amongst nearly all serial murderers: They all (usually already as children) were violent toward animals. Once a basis of violence was laid, it is difficult to limit these only to certain forms of life, or situations. This is the case for those who torture animals and later humans, just like soldiers, who were trained to kill and later have to return to civilian life. Of-course not every soldier who had to kill many humans in war times becomes a mass murderer in civilian life but psychologically they are forced to carry an enormous load (the suicide rate of former soldiers of war is very high: the willingness to use violence is directed against oneself).

Conclusion - Violence should be avoided in all forms, since it is difficult to tolerate violence within some situations and to condemn it at the same time in other situations. There was a reason why the peace fighters Mahatma Gandhi, Albert Schweitzer, Albert Einstein etc. refused to eat animals, precisely in order to avoid the necessary violence associated with meat production. If one is against practicing violence, then one morally cannot oblige others (e.g. butchers) to commit violence. Peace-loving humans therefore cannot condemn violence between humans and simultaneously look the other way when violence is inflicted toward animals. Case has been registered with Shastry Nagar police station and investigation into the matter is on.


