TEMPLES NO JAIN TEMPLE WAS BURNT IN KASHMIR: OFFICIALS



The temporary structure housing a Jain temple in a local hotel was not burnt by a mob but was dismantled as a local hotel's contract with a Mumbai-based travel agency which built the structure on its premises has not been renewed. In the wake of reports in newspapers around India that the only Jain temple in Kashmir had been burnt by mobs leading the ongoing protests in the Valley, hotel and State officials told that no such incident had taken place. According to Ghulam Mohiuddin, manager of Silver

Star Hotel in Lasjan on the outskirts of Srinagar, the temporary structure was built as per contract with Gem Tours and Travels, a Mumbai-based travel agency, which wanted to provide a place where Jain tourists from other parts of India could worship while visiting Kashmir. But the three-year contract ended and was not extended, so the structure was also dismantled, he said. The temple was established to attract Jain tourists. "As the situation in the Valley worsened and the tourist inflow declined, the contract was not renewed and we thought there is no need for this," he added. The 8x8 prefabricated structure was dismantled in the presence of the priest, Hans Raj, on August 10.

Mr. Mohiuddin categorically denied that the temple was burnt or destroyed by a mob. "This is just not true. It is a fact that a large mob passed through this area also but no one entered our premises so the question of touching the temple does not arise," he told The Hindu. Before the hotel management decided to remove the structure, the owners of the travel agency were contacted through the priest Hans Raj, who hails from Uttar Pradesh. "The idols were removed and properly handed over to them when they arrived in Srinagar the next day," he said, adding the rumours seemed to be a conspiracy to spread hatred against Kashmiris. Deputy Commissioner (Srinagar) Meraj Kakroo also rubbished reports about the Jain temple being attacked. "The report about the burning of the temple is baseless and mischievous," he said. He added that no proper temple existed and "as per our information, it was an internal arrangement made by the hotel owners." Members of the community said there is, in fact, no Jain temple in Kashmir. While there were 40-odd Jain families living in the Valley prior to militancy, only five have stayed back. "There is no Jain temple here, though a family has set up one in their house," Amit Jain, a businessman, said. Doshi family, which built the temple, flew in to Srinagar the day after the temple was dismantled and packed the idols in cardboard boxes and returned to Sabarmati.

Ahimsa Foundation feels that Jain Samaj should restrain in expressing its reactions and views in delicate religious and political matters affecting the feelings of other communities.

HONOURS & AWARDS DIPAK JAIN NAMED INSEAD DEAN



Noted Indian-American academician Dipak Jain has been named as Dean of leading international business school INSEAD and will take up his new role in March 2011. Jain, a Dean Emeritus at Northwestern University's prestigious Kellogg School of Management, will succeed J Frank Brown, who will step down in 2011. Among Jain's responsibilities would be to look for opportunities to build INSEAD programmes in China and India as the business school focuses on growing its global presence and attracting more students from the developing countries. Jain, who was Kellogg's Dean from 2001-2009, is part of a growing list of Indian-origin academicians assuming leading roles at foreign universities. At Kellogg, Jain was the Sandy and Morton Goldman Professor in Entrepreneurial Studies and Professor of Marketing, a Chair he held since 1994. He stepped down from his Kellogg dean post last summer but remained a professor. A

graduate of Guwahati University, the Assam-native received a Masters in management science and a PhD in marketing from the University of Texas at Dallas. Jain is currently executive editor of the Sasin Journal of Management (Thailand) and a member of the Editorial Board of the Asian Journal of Marketing (Singapore). Apart from teaching, Jain is currently involved creating a business school in Bangladesh that will focus on entrepreneurship and small business management for women from countries such as Afghanistan, Sri Lanka [Images] and Pakistan. The second project he is working on is to start a full-fledged university in Angola. A noted scholar in marketing and entrepreneurship, Jain has published about 60 articles in scholarly and professional journals and three books.

He has presented and lectured at universities throughout the world and is the recipient of numerous awards for teaching and scholarship. He has been a member of review committees at Harvard, UCLA, the Chinese University of Hong Kong and Northwestern. He serves on international advisory boards and councils such as the Sasin Graduate Institute of Business Administration (Chulalongkorn University), the Carey Business School (Johns Hopkins) and American University in Cairo. Member of the American Marketing Association and The Institute of Management Sciences, Jain has consulted with companies such as IBM, AT&T, Nestle [Get Quote], Boeing, Accenture, Thompson Electronics and American Express. Established in 1957, INSEAD - 'the Business School for the World' - has campuses in Europe, Asia (Singapore) and in West Asia (Abu Dhabi), a research centre in Israel and an office in New York. Based in Europe, it is one of the world's leading and largest graduate business schools and research institution.


ARTIST VINITA JAIN'S WORK FEATURED IN KUDOS INTERNATIONAL ART COMPETITION

EU REVISES LAWS TO BETTER PROTECT ANIMALS USED FOR SCIENTIFIC EXPERIMENTS



Brussels, 9 September 2010 The European Parliament has voted to revise legislation on animals used for scientific purposes. The revised legislation, first proposed by the European Commission in 2008, will strengthen the protection of animals still needed for research and safety testing. The new directive will also play a significant role in minimising the number of animals used in experiments, and require alternatives to be used where possible, whilst ensuring a level playing field for EU industry and enhancing the quality of research conducted in the EU. European Environment Commissioner Janez Potočnik said: "Today's vote ends a long negotiation process, which has shown how sensitive and important the issues at stake are. However, everyone agreed that it is vital to improve the situation for animals still needed in scientific research and safety testing, whilst maintaining a high standard of research and improving the focus on finding alternative methods to animal testing. The European Union will soon have the highest standards of experimental animal welfare in the world."...

SEVERAL ASTHADHATU IDOLS STOLEN FROM JAIN TEMPLE IN RAJSAMAND, RAJASTHAN

JAIPUR: Amid Janmasthami preparations, a few unidentified miscreants stole six asthadhatu idols, jewellery and other valuable items from Kesariyanath Jain temple in the Bhim area of Rajsamand district. According to the report filed on the complaint of one Bhanwar Lal, miscreants barged into the temple premises after breaking the main channel gate. They stole six ashtadhatu idols four big and two small, silver mukut and umbrella along with other valuable items. When members of the temple management committee visited the premises to offer prayers, they were shocked to find the channel gate broken, and the idols missing. Sources said it was the second time that idols have been stolen from the temple. The devotees staged a demonstration against the police and demanded immediate recovery of the idols and arrest of the miscreants.

110-YR-OLD TEMPLE BURGLED

MYSORE: A century-year-old Jain temple was reportedly burgled in the Heggadadevana Kote police limits. A group of thieves gained entry into the Ananthanatha Swamy Temple on Mahaveer Road at Surgur after breaking the small wooden doors using crowbars. The thieves decamped with gold and silver items, including idols, and money from the hundi. Three pairs of gold chains and ear rings each put on the idols, a silver pot weighing 10 kg, silver lamp stands, silver plates and silver idols and a mask have been stolen from the 110-year-old temple. Temple priest Manmatharaju (65) told police that he heard a noise around 2 am but he thought it to be a truck moving on the road. But shock was in store for the priest when he opened the main door of the temple early morning. Jain Association president Devendraiah filed a complaint with the police.

BORIVALI TEMPLE THEFT: COPS ARREST EIGHT

The Mumbai Police Crime Branch arrested eight persons for allegedly killing a watchman of the Jain temple in Borivali and grievously injuring another. The suspects had allegedly decamped with idols and ornaments from the temple. The arrested have been identified as Haroon Sheikh (40), Ramesh Patil alias Bhaijan (40), Santosh Bhoir, Rajguru Singh, Suresh Gupta (18), Vinodkumar Yadav (22), Michael Thapa (20) and Mukeshkumar Yadav (18). While four suspects were arrested from Goregaon, the rest of them were picked up from Ghansoli, Navi Mumbai. On August 22, a group of eight assailants struck at the Chandraprabhu Nandeshwar Deep Digambar Jain Temple, Borivali. They attacked the guards with iron rods, killing Devi Singh and injuring Rajesh Joshi. They then made away with statues made of metal alloy and other ornaments. The religious sentiments of the Jain community were outraged following the incident. The Crime Branch had been given the descriptions of the suspects by a local ambulance driver, Pappu, who had noticed the dacoits fleeing with the loot. Almost all the suspects have a prior criminal record of thefts and robberies. Haroon is the kingpin of the gang. He spent time in jail with Bhaijan and the duo had plotted the dacoity around two years ago. While the former was in jail in a Prevention of Immoral Trafficking Act case, Bhaijan was serving jail term for scrap theft cases. They had planned to target the temple when it was consecrated in 2005.

PUJARI GANG HELD WITH STOLEN IDOL

MUMBAI: The police arrested three members of the Ravi Pujari gang who had stolen a 'Panchdhatu' idol from a Jain temple at Mira Road last year. Those arrested are a part of the same group which had committed a series of firing offences in the western suburbs in the last two months at Pujari's behest. The arrested accused, Deepak Singh alias Thakur alias Vikram, have been booked in 15 cases across Mumbai and neighboring districts. Another accused, Vicky Deval, was wanted in five cases while Kisan Dhanraj is wanted in three offences.

THEFT OF 1,000-YR-OLD JAIN TEMPLE STATUE CAUSE OUTRAGE

AJMER: A statue made of eight elements of Trikal Chobisi' in Jain temple at Jodha Gali of Dargah Bazaar was stolen on. The statue is said to be a thousand year old and the is a major centre of faith for the community. Police are investigating the matter. According to the police, some people went to worship at the temple and discovered the statue of Trikal Chobisi' missing from its stand. The temple locks were broken. The temple is in a thickly populated area. As the news spread there was outrage among devotees who collected before the temple to protest. There is bhoot, bhavisha and vartaman and for that there are 24 Tirthankars as per Jain religion. The Trikal Chobisi is the oldest and belonged to bhoot kaal (past), said

Sudarshan Jain of Naala Bazaar. He said that the statute was made up of eight elements and is rare and invaluable. Police utilised the dog squad but were unable to many any headway.

WHY IS CURD NOT FORBIDDEN? DEVENDRA, E-Mail: devendra@planet.nl In Jain tradition milk (produced in non-himsak way) and dahi (hindi word for traditional Indian yoghurt like preparation, yoghurt is closer word.) have been always permitted. Let us first understand the three words curd, yoghurt and dahi. Dahi and yoghurt and curd are obtained by different processes from milk have different taste. For the details of these processes one can refer to dairy product literature freely available on webs, books, etc. What happens to curd when swallowed and passes through our digestive system is a complex matter and to explain we need to take help of modern sciences such as biotechnology. Also a common notion that when bacteria's and many micro-organism are swallowed will die and we will incur himsa is not necessarily 100% true!! It would be extremely difficult to say how much himsa is incurred. We should also understand that bahujivi,s (multiple souls as in potatos) like tubers/kandmool (roots) are different from bacterial culture, the former will die as we eat. In our body also reside many bacteria and produce many useful substances e.g. vitamin B12, etc. Our body temperature of 37 to 38 degree centigrade provide comfortable environment for many bacteria and bacteria culture varies with temperature and some other factors. Also to note that many bacteri can withstand our saliva and gastric juices. Many Jains warm up curd before consuming under the belief that number of bacteria's and micro-organism will decrease and thereby minimum living will be swallowed/consumed. When we see a pack of yoghurt in western style supermarkets a lot is mentioned about Nutritional component and values however nothing is mentioned about bacteria culture except some similar product which are specifically meant to swallow/consume certain health beneficial bacteria culture. In past I have come across some emails on Jainlist. These people knowledgeable about biotechnology and fermentation processes, I believe, can make the subject more clear like crystal. In the end I would endeavor to say that we incur very little or no himsa when we swallow dahi, yoghurt or curd. Preparation using renets which are himsak are not permited.
